pdnet Standards

The pdnet Standards provide a practical structure for schools and settings to self-evaluate current provision and reflect on the effectiveness of their organisation in meeting the diverse needs of children and young people with physical disability.

Standards have been developed for all three educational phases: Early Years, Schools and Post-16 and are free to download from the pdnet website.

Self-evaluation Tool

The Self-evaluation Tool provides a simple, effective way for schools and settings to evaluate their provision against the pdnet Standards.

Users are able to record their judgements against each Standard, upload and store evidence, and create a personalised action plan which can be exported to a PDF upon completion. The self-evaluation can be revisited at anytime to be reviewed and updated.

Effective Practice Hub

The Effective Practice Hub holds a wealth of resources including information and advice leaflets, case studies, risk assessment examples and ‘top tips’ to help support children and young people with physical disability.

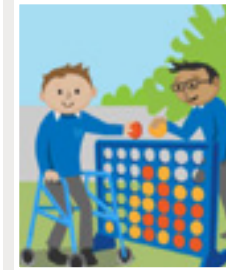
All resources within the Hub have been developed and shared by professionals from across the physical disability sector and then quality assured by the pdnet Editorial Board.

Each module is approximately 1 hour in length and uses custom graphics and scenario-based learning to help users to understand the barriers or challenges that can be faced by children and young people with physical disability and the **steps** that can be taken to overcome these.
