slippery creatures.



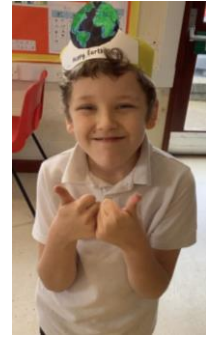
A lovely moment of friendship and engaging
